

PASTOR'S JOURNEY WITH THE KINDRED PARISH





What does Evangelical Lutheran Church say about affirmation of baptism?

The **Evangelical Lutheran Church in America** views baptism as a significant part of our faith journey. When we emerge from the baptismal waters, we begin a new life as children of God. Our baptism sets us on a lifelong journey characterized by several key aspects:

- 1. Living Among God's Faithful People: We are chosen not for position or privilege but to live as faithful witnesses to the Good News of Jesus Christ. In community, we strengthen our faith walk and serve in mission¹.
- 2. **Faith Practices**: The liturgy for the **Affirmation of Baptism** outlines faith practices that grow out of our baptism. These practices include:
 - Living among God's faithful people
 - Hearing the word of God and sharing in the Lord's Supper
 - Proclaiming the good news of God in Christ through word and deed
 - Serving all people following Jesus' example
 - \circ Striving for justice and peace in all the earth².
- 3. **New Identity**: Baptism marks us with the cross of Christ and seals us with the Spirit. <u>We receive a new identity as followers of Jesus, and His story becomes our story³</u>.

So, as we affirm our baptism, we commit to living out these practices and embracing our role as children of God.
